THE WORD

Ezekiel 33:7-20 "So you, son of man: I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel; therefore you shall hear a word from My mouth and warn them for Me. 8 "When I say to the wicked,'O wicked man, you shall surely die!' and you do not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood I will require at your hand. 9 "Nevertheless if you warn the

wicked to turn from his way, and he does not turn from his way, he shall die in his iniquity; but you have delivered your soul. 10 "Therefore you, O son of man, say to the house of Israel:'Thus you say, "If our transgressions and our sins lie upon us, and we pine away in them, how can we then live?"' 11 "Say to them: As I live,' says the Lord GOD,'I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live. Turn, turn from your evil ways! For why should you die, O house of Israel?' 12 "Therefore you, O son of man, say to the children of your people.'The righteousness of the righteous man shall not deliver him in the day of his transgression; as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall because of it in the day that he turns from his wickedness; nor shall the righteous be able to live because of his righteousness in the day that he sins.' 13 "When I say to the righteous that he shall surely live, but he trusts in his own righteousness and commits iniquity, none of his righteous works shall be remembered; but because of the iniquity that he has committed, he shall die. 14 "Again, when I say to the wicked, You shall surely die,' if he turns from his sin and does what is lawful and right, 15 "if the wicked restores the pledge, gives back what he has stolen, and walks in the statutes of life without committing iniquity, he shall surely live; he shall not die. 16 "None of his sins which he has committed shall be remembered against him; he has done what is lawful and right; he shall surely live. 17 "Yet the children of your people say,'The way of the Lord is not fair.' But it is their way which is not fair! 18 "When the righteous turns from his righteousness and commits iniquity, he shall die because of it. 19 "But when the wicked turns from his wickedness and does what is lawful and right, he shall live because of it. 20 "Yet you say,'The way of the Lord is not fair.' O house of Israel, I will judge every one of you according to his own ways."

1 Corinthians 10:1-13 Moreover, brethren, I do not want you to be unaware that all our fathers were under the cloud, all passed through the sea, 2 all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, 3 all ate the same spiritual food, 4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them, and that Rock was Christ. 5 But with most of them God was not well pleased, for their bodies were scattered in the wilderness. 6 Now these things became our examples, to the intent that we should not lust after evil things as they also lusted. 7 And do not become idolaters as were some of them. As

it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play." 8 Nor let us commit sexual immorality, as some of them did, and in one day twenty-three thousand fell; 9 nor let us tempt Christ, as some of them also tempted, and were destroyed by serpents; 10 nor complain, as some of them also complained, and were destroyed by the destroyer. 11 Now all these things happened to them as examples, and they were written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the ages have come. 12 Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall. 13 No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.

SERMON

Luke 13:1-9 There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things? 3 "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish. 4 "Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? 5 "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish." 6 He also spoke this parable: "A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. 7 "Then he said to the keeper of his vineyard, 'Look, for three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree and find none. Cut it down; why does it use up the ground?' 8 "But he answered and said to him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and fertilize it. 9 'And if it bears fruit, well. But if not, after that you can cut it down.""

Christ Does Everything Possible to Bring Us to Repentance

The proper attitude when we see others suffer is not to judge them but to repent ourselves. Such repentance is absolutely necessary since sin cannot enter the presence of God. LETTER FROM TREASURER

Dear Members of Faith

Last Wednesday I was able to finalize a 20.000 line of credit at Ergo Bank (formerly Farmers State Bank). We needed this partially form the purchase and installation of the security system in and around the School and Church building. We are approved for a state grant to get reimbursed for this but their timing for the reimbursement is yet to be determined. When we voted and approved the purchase it appeared the general fund had sufficient funds to make this feasible without borrowing any money, but things happen. Our annual operating expenses for the general fund has creeped up to \$200,000 which may not sound like that much but it is \$3,850 per week. When I consider our historical giving it will take an average Sunday attendance of 112 to reach that amount which too me that looks impossible. During

my last term as treasurer I was astonished by how God worked to make what I thought was impossible - seemingly easy. At that time, we were able to pay off a \$20,000 loan and generate a nice \$30,000 cushion. Is this time different? We do have some decisions in front of us that need careful and prayerful consideration but isn't that always the case. Please continue to look to God and pray for our congregation and its finances.

Mission offerings total for this quarter are currently at \$2,750. Our goal for the quarter is \$10,000. We only have one month remaining in the quarter.

The council discussed the possibility of accepting electronic offerings. Jim Brown is working on fixing the lights in the classrooms.

Dan Thiem will keep an eye on the LP tanks for now.

Stain glass windows are at a pause for now. Total cost would be around \$80,000 on the low side. Currently we have \$10,000 in the stain glass window fund. Also the lady in Appleton who has been working on the designs would like a better idea of what we want before she moves forward.
