PRE-SERVICE DEVOTION

The First Image: The Evil Within Us

Whether man believes it or not, it is most certain and true that no torture can compare with the worst of all evils, namely, the evil within man himself. The evils within him are more numerous and far greater than any which he feels. If a man were to feel his evil, he would feel hell, for he has hell within himself. You ask, "How can that be?" The prophet says, "All men are liers" (psalm 116:11), and again, "Every man living is nothing but vanity" (Psalm 39:6). But to be a liar and a vanity is to be without truth and reality. And to be without truth and reality is to be without God and to be nothing. This condition in turn is to be in hell and to be damned.

Therefore, when God in his mercy chastens us, he shows us and lays upon us only the lighter evils, for God knows that if he were to lead a man to a full knowledge of his own evils, that man would die at once.

Thus we observe how those to whom their true evil has been revealed rage furiously against themesleves.
