Apology of the Augsburg Confession, Article IV, Paragraph 82

It is certain that sins are forgiven because of Christ, the propitiator, according to Rom. 3:25, "Whom God put forward as an expiation," and Paul adds, "to be received by faith." So this propitiator benefits us when by faith we receive the mercy promised in him and set it against the wrath and judgment of God. There is a similar statement in Heb. 4:14-16, "Since then we have a great high priest, let us then with confidence draw near." By bidding us draw near to God with trust not in our merits but in Christ, the high priest, this statement requires faith.

Selah ³ You have taken away all Your wrath; You have turned from the fierceness of Your anger. ⁴ Restore us, O God of our salvation, And cause Your anger toward us to cease. ⁵ Will You be angry with us forever? Will You prolong Your anger to all generations? ⁶ Will You not revive us again, That Your people may rejoice in You? ⁷ Show us Your mercy, LORD, And grant us Your salvation. ⁸ I will hear what God the LORD will speak, For He will speak peace To His people and to His saints; But let them not turn back to folly. ⁹ Surely His salvation *is* near to those who fear Him, That glory may dwell in our land.

SERMON

Ephesians 2:12-18 ¹² that at that time you were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. ¹³ But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴ For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, ¹⁵ having abolished in His flesh the enmity, *that is*, the law of commandments *contained* in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man *from* the two, *thus* making peace, ¹⁶ and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. ¹⁷ And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. ¹⁸ For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Fa-ther.
